# The Splendours of Scotland

Scotland was a country that not even the Romans could conquer. The English tried and tried again to subdue her, perennially larger in fighting force and superior in equipment. For the Highland way of life, only musket, canon, and a series of calamitous events led to the defeat which would set her on the path of submission to the kingdom in the south.

This is a land that at its narrowest point is but 25 miles wide. She is a land of bounteous wildlife, natural beauty, hundreds of islands, thousands of lochs (lakes), and consequently, rarefied light. A land of druids, warriors, saints, and brilliant minds, she is imbued with a magic hitherto undimmed.



### Day 1 - Arrival Day - Edinburgh - Sunday, October 5th

Arrive in Edinburgh, Scotland by Sunday, 5<sup>th</sup> October. Some will fly into Edinburgh via Chicago or New York and others via London. You will be met at the airport and transferred to the hotel. Our welcome dinner will be that night.

We'll find ourselves at the Kimpton Hotel by Charlotte Square's pretty park in the heart of the city.







#### Day 2 – Edinburgh – Monday, October 6<sup>th</sup>

Our expedition begins in Scotland's capital, a city dominated by volcanic hillscape, a castle scratching the skyline, and iconic monuments, some of which looks remarkably similar to that of ancient Greece. The heart of the Scottish Enlightenment, where the likes of Adam Smith left his mark on the world, this is one of the finest cities anywhere to be found.





We will explore the city's historic heart, centred around sights which will look familiar to all those who glimpsed Her late Majesty the Queen's final procession through Edinburgh. Alongside the Royal Mile, St. Giles' Cathedral, Edinburgh Castle, and Holyrood Palace, where we'll enjoy a rather special private tour, we will head to the city's symbolic heights, Calton Hill and Arthur's Seat, guided by a Shakespearean actor expert in Scotland's history.




### Day 3 – Edinburgh to St. Andrews – Tuesday, October 7th

Today we daytrip northeastwards to the symbolic home of Christianity in Scotland, also the home of golf and meeting place of the future King and Queen. In St. Andrews we will be met by a character of great local repute, replete with stories, who will show us around the old Abbey ruins, walk us the final two holes of the storied course, above which we'll have lunch, and take us around the old buildings and gardens of one of the world's most famous universities, the oldest in Scotland.

On our return to Edinburgh we will explore the most picturesque of villages of the East Neuk of Fife, Anstruther, famed for her fishing heritage and colourful houses, and Elie, complete with her film-set-ready beach and dramatic cliffs.







### Day 4 – Edinburgh to Inverness – Wednesday, October 8th

Today we travel northwards towards the hallowed realm of the Scottish Highlands. We will stop at the historic Battle of Bannockburn, the site of a fabled victory for the Scots. Thereafter we visit Scone Palace, the crowning place of Scottish kings, whose owners, the Earls of Mansfield, are old friends of Eddy's, for a private tour.

We carry on north toward Inverness, stopping at the stunning Falls of Bruar, and for a whisky tour and tasting at Tomatin, whose 36-year old is currently the world's number one ranked. Our resting place tonight is the Highland idyll of Newhall Mains, belonging to Eddy's friend, Euan Ramsay, complete with its own airfield and asado.







# Day 5 – The Scottish Highlands – Thursday, October 9th

Eddy will give us a tour of Culloden Battlefield and explain the dynamics behind the Jacobite uprising, Bonnie Prince Charlie, and the end of the ancient Highland way of life.

To earn our sumptuous lunch, we will take a gentle walk up to Fyrish Monument, an amazing stone structure atop a ridgeline with stunning views over the Cromarty and Moray Firths (a firth is an estuary).

That afternoon we will enjoy a private tour of Castle Leod from The Earl of Cromartie, Chief of Clan Mackenzie and a wonderful storyteller. Eyes to the sky for giant redwoods too!







Day 6 – The Scottish Highlands – Friday, October 10<sup>th</sup>

Eddy will take us through beautiful Highland scenery via the Highlands' famed outfitters, Campbells, situated in the charming village of Beauly, an ideal spot to procure gifts and keepsakes, before heading up the eastern flank of the Great Glen to the vertiginous, Plodda Falls.

We'll have lunch along the banks of Loch Ness, a beautiful spot to behold one of the world's most famous 'lakes'. We'll take the afternoon to enjoy the comforts and spoiling splendours of Newhall Mains and her glorious grounds, with any luck taking one of their phenomenal cocktails under the evening sun on their croquet lawn.







# Day 7 – the road to the Isle of Skye – Saturday, October 11th

On our way Skyewards, we visit Urquhart Castle, spectacularly situated on the flanks of Loch Ness and among the more significant Highland fortifications of Robert the Bruce, the outlaw King of Scotland.

After a water's edge lunch, we come to Eilean Donan Castle – a sea-lochside gem, one of the most picturesque sites in the world, surrounded by the Kyle of Rhea (Rhea being a Celtic mythological hero and a kyle being a strait or sound).

Our next resting place is another friendly refuge, the beautiful home of Eddy's friends Jimmy and Stella, just a few miles down the shoreline from Eilean Donan.








# Day 8 – Isles of Skye, Rona, and Raasay – Sunday, October 12th

Today we take to the waters along the spectacular Jurassic coastline of Isle of Skye then into the Sea of the Hebrides to look for sea eagles, puffins, and insular stags. After a short, scenic walk to a stunning viewpoint, having moored up on the barely-inhabited but utterly charming Isle of Rona, we have a freshly-caught seafood lunch, courtesy of our captain in the tranquility of the harbour. On our return via the Isle of Raasay and her picturesque distillery we will keep a keen eye out for dolphins. We return to our lodgings to sundown an evening of stirring Highland music.







### Day 9 - Knoydart Peninsula - Monday, October 13th

Knoydart holds the least accessible areas on the British mainland. Estuaries hidden to all but the very most knowledgeable and skillful, mountains to mesmerise the mind, and wildness to stir spirits and senses alike. We'll be in the care of Billy the boatman and ne'er a soul had more riveting stories to tell. Should his young apprentice be in tow (he will be), there'll be treats for the ears as well.

Billy will skirt us around the beautiful northern shore of the peninsula, leading us to a coastal enclave reachable only by boat, home to a restaurant the rarefied likes of which so few of us have the joyous privilege to know.







# Day 10 - Departures - Tuesday, October 14th

Having had a sumptuous farewell dinner in our seaside roost, watching the sun come down over Rhea's mystical waters one last time, we'll have our breakfast and make for Inverness for our onward connections.

Inverness Airport has six direct flights a day to London and Inverness Railway Station has fifteen trains to Edinburgh and another 15 trains to Glasgow every day for those flying back to the US or elsewhere from those two airports.

He retraced Hannibal's route over the Alps with elephants; led numerous expeditions in Central Asia, China, Tibet, Africa, the Amazon and elsewhere, including 21 expeditions to the North Pole; and has been listed in *The Guinness Book of World Records* for the first free fall sky-dive in history at the North Pole.

Jack founded **Wheeler Expeditions in 1976**, which has conducted exclusive and bespoke expeditions to unusual destinations across the globe for over 40 years. On a personal note, in the early 80's he married **Ms. Rebel Holiday** in St Tropez, France, who is a partner in the business.
