Spain Exploration: The Triumph of Christianity in Spain

Over 3,000 years ago (1100 BC), sea-faring Phoenicians founded trading colonies like Gadir (now Cadiz) along the Mediterranean coast of a land they called *i-shaphan-im*, the land of hyraxes (a small furry animal similar to a rabbit with tiny ears). Centuries later, Roman settlers Latinized this to *Hispania* – España to the Spanish, Spain to us. **By 180 AD, both Roman settlers and local peoples such as Celts and Iberians had begun adopting Christianity.** By 250 AD, Christian churches were in a number of communities throughout Spain.

Christian civilization had become deeply established by the time of Rome's crumbling in the early 400's, when Spain was taken over by two waves of Germanic tribes. The first was the Vandals, who called their conquered territory Vandalusia. Next to come were the Visigoths. Becoming Christians, the Visigoths established a vibrant and prosperous kingdom with its capital at the old Roman city of Toletum (Toledo) that lasted for almost 300 years.

In 711, an invading force of Berbers from North Africa, who had just adopted a religion called Islam, landed at a huge rock promontory called Mons Calpe at the southern tip of Hispania. The invaders' leader was Tariq ibn Ziyad, so they renamed the monolith *Jabal Tariq*, the Rock of Tariq – subsequently shortened to Gibraltar. Waves of Moslem invaders followed, sweeping the Visigoths away and conquering all Hispania, which they named *Al-Andalus*, their pronunciation of Vandalusia. Now the southern region is called "Andalucia."

This coming October, you are invited to personally experience one of Western Civilization's most heroic achievements – Spain's triumph of Christianity over foreign conquest that took eight centuries to complete. We will explore one of the most epic sagas in all history, known as the *Reconquista*, Reconquest, from start to finish.

Along the way, we will learn a great deal while we enjoy modern day Spain, with luxury hotels, marvelous Spanish cuisine and wine, immerse ourselves in Spanish culture, and have so much fun together along the way.

Day 1 – Oct 9, 2026 - Arrive BCN / Barcelona

You will be met at the airport and driven to our hotel, the lovely Barcelona Astoria Hotel



Meet for lunch and then light afternoon activities.

We will visit **Barri Gòtic** with early medieval layers help set the “pre-Reconquista” stage. The Barri Gòtic or Gothic Quarter goes back to Roman times, continuously occupied since, with many medieval buildings.

A highlight is the Roman Barcino with Visigothic remains. *Barcilonum* to the Romans, *Barchinona* to the Christian Visigoths, *Barcelonès* for the Catalans today. The Underground Museum revealing the Christian Visigothic city.



Enjoy dinner at **7 Portes**, historic Catalan cuisine. Overnight at Barcelona Astoria Hotel.

Day 2 – Oct 10 - Barcelona (Gaudí + early medieval context)

Today we explore Spain's most vibrant city, famous for the unique architectural wonders of [Antoni Gaudí](#) (1852-1926), such as the Cathedral Sagrada Familia (below) and **Casa Batlló** (right) or **La Pedrera**.



Midday - Lunch in El Born Santa Maria del Mar, a key medieval church (13–14th c., post-Reconquista Catalonia)

Afternoon gives you options, such as the Museu d'Història de Barcelona (MUHBA) a Roman/Visigothic museum with many historic artifacts.

You might like time to stroll along Barcelona's most famous tree-lined street, *La Rambla*, full of shops, pubs, art galleries, flower gardens, and so much else...



Day 3 – Oct 11 - BCN → OVD (Asturias) → Covadonga → Burgos
Birthplace of the Reconquista, Birthplace of El Cid

Morning-Fly BCN–OVD - Drive to Covadonga (symbolic start of Reconquista, 722)
Covadonga

We take an early morning flight to northwest Spain and drive into the Picos de Europa mountains brings us to [Covadonga](#), where Visigoth Christian Knights in 722 began retaking Spain from Islamic invaders. We visit the Holy Cave (Cueva Santa, right) and the Basilica. We'll learn the legend of Pelagius (Spanish Pelayo, Portuguese Palagio) is revered in Spain as the founder of the Reconquista.



Lunch nearby (simple Asturian fare) features Fabada asturiana and cabrales cheese.

Day 3 – Oct 11 *(continued)*

Afternoon drive to Burgos with exceptional scenery that you see on the right...

We arrive at Burgos to spend the night in the lovely Burgos Palacio Hotel




Day 4 – Oct 12 - Burgos → Madrid

El Cid at Full Strength

El Cid is the most famous Christian Knight of the Reconquista, so famous that Charlton Heston starred in a movie about him with Sofia Loren.

Activities today in Burgos, include the Burgos Cathedral, Gothic masterpiece (UNESCO) with the tombs of El Cid and his wife, **Doña Jimena**.

Visit **Museo de Burgos** – See the Tizona Sword of El Cid, [confirmed by spectroscopic analysis](#) to date from the time of his life (1043-1099)

Lunch - Morcilla de Burgos, specialty is roast lamb (lechazo)

Day 4 – Oct 12 *(continued)*

Afternoon - Drive 2 ½ hours to Madrid, enroute we'll visit the spectacular Gormaz Castle, occupied by El Cid in 1087

We'll spend our evening in Madrid, the capital of Spain.

We may enjoy a gentle walk from **Plaza Mayor** to **Puerta del Sol** – to this day a popular late afternoon/early evening pastime in Spanish culture.

Day 5 – Oct 13 - Madrid

Visigoths → Christian kingdoms → imperial Spain

Morning - National Archaeological Museum - Focus areas: Visigothic crowns (Guarrazar Treasure) Treasure of the Visigothic Kingdom in the museum Kingdom of Toledo material
Lunch will be near **Barrio de las Letras**.

We will visit the world famous **Prado Museum** - The Prado has the greatest collection of Reconquista and Post-Reconquista Spanish art.

The Surrender of Granada by Francisco Pradilla Ortiz Boabdil, ruler of last Muslim kingdom in Spain, surrenders to Ferdinand & Isabella, January 2, 1492. We'll also see Velázquez (court culture of Reconquista-completed Spain) and other religious art post-1492.

Morning – Depart to Toledo



Day 9 – Oct 17 - Granada → Las Navas de Tolosa → Granada


Turning point of the Reconquista

Then we'll see the Royal Chapel which has the tombs of Fernando and Isabel.

Dr. Jack Wheeler, has been called the “real life Indiana Jones” by the Wall Street Journal has traveled to all 193 countries on all seven continents. He’s had two parallel careers: one in adventure and exploration with *Wheeler Expeditions*; the other in the field of geopolitics. After receiving his Ph.D. in Philosophy from the University of Southern California, where he lectured on Aristotelian ethics.

His adventures began early. The youngest Eagle Scout in history at age 12, he climbed the Matterhorn at age 14, swam the Hellespont (LIFE Magazine 12/12/60) and lived with Amazon headhunters at 16, hunted a man-eating tiger in Vietnam at 17, and started an export business in Vietnam at 19. He wrote *The Adventurer’s Guide* (New York: Mackay, 1975), described by Merv Griffin as “the definitive book for anyone wishing to lead a more adventurous and exciting life.” He has three “first contacts” with tribes never before contacted by the outside world: a clan of Aushiri in the Amazon, the Wali-ali-fo in New Guinea, and a band of Bushmen in the Kalahari. He retraced Hannibal’s route over the Alps with elephants; led numerous expeditions in Central Asia, China, Tibet, Africa, the Amazon and elsewhere, including 21 expeditions to the North Pole; and has been listed in *The Guinness Book of World Records* for the first free fall sky-dive in history at the North Pole. His company has conducted exclusive expeditions to dozens of countries across the globe for over 35 years.

Jack Wheeler founded Wheeler Expeditions in 1976, today we lead bespoke expeditions each year to unusual destinations. The company has conducted exclusive expeditions to dozens of countries across the globe for over 35 years. On a personal note, in the early 80’s he married Ms. Rebel Holiday in St Tropez, France, and these days, Wheeler Expeditions is a family affair. They are delighted that their two grown sons Brandon Holiday Wheeler and Jackson Holiday Wheeler are living adventurous lives.
