

# The Real Magic of Christmas is Jesus

<sup>7</sup> and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them. (Luke 2.7 NIV)

Luke 2:7 is a verse filled with quiet humility. The birth of Jesus, the long-awaited Messiah, happens not in a palace or even in the comfort of a home, but in the simplest and most overlooked of places. There is no room for Him in the inn, yet God makes room in a manger.

This reminds us that God often appears in the unexpected, the ordinary, and the overlooked. The world may shut its doors, but God's purposes are never hindered. The manger becomes a cradle of grace—a sign that holiness seeks us not in our perfection, but in the ordinary corners of our lives.

Mary's simple actions—wrapping, holding, laying her child down—also speak to God's tenderness. In Jesus, God comes close enough to be held. Close enough to need care. Close enough to share our human vulnerability.

This verse invites us to ask:

#### Where might God be quietly present in places we overlook?

#### What mangers—simple or unexpected spaces—might He be asking us to make room in?

The Christ who once found no room in the inn, now seeks room in hearts willing to welcome Him with humility and love. And when we make that space, even the simplest places in our lives can become holy ground.

The magic of Christmas is that Jesus (God) came as a baby, vulnerable and with humility - Grace wrapped up in a small bundle. Let us all be reminded that this is the ultimate Christmas gift.

# Onwards, Upwards and into the future for CuSO!

As we wind up 2025, the past 40 years of activity in Cursillo has seen close to 4000 Cursillistas experience the opportunity of the 2 and 3 day weekends. When Cursillo arrived in Brisbane in 1985 from Grafton Diocese, Fr Bruce Worthington, ably assisted by his wife Barbara, gently nurtured Cursillo and we will be

forever grateful for his dedication and passion for the Cursillo movement. His reflection booklet was given to all Celebration Dinner attendees, and you can read it on the Cursillo-Brisbane Website.

The past year has had its own milestones to mark the 40<sup>th</sup>. In June, members of Synod acknowledged the work of Cursillo throughout the Diocese and this acknowledgment reinforced the work by 182 teams, Secretariat and Diocesan Servant Community members. Cursillo is a whole of Diocese programme and our Episcopal Advisor and Friend, Bp Cam refers to Cursillo as a ministry of the Laos – lay and clergy working together and this has been the case and continues today. We thank our clergy Cursillistas and those non-Cursillista clergy who also support Cursillo.

The **2-day #83 weekend**, held at Luther Heights/Coolum Beach in August, was led by Ann Martin-Victor and her team. This combined weekend for men and ladies stayed true to the method with 20 candidates giving positive feedback. Interestingly, the variation to the Clausura, requiring all to move out of the campsite to the Uniting Church at Coolum also had positive reviews from sponsors, team and candidates. All candidates experienced a wonderful finale to their weekend.

Highly successful Ultreyas at Bundaberg West, Bribie Island and Peninsula had excellent attendance. Then to cap the year off, the Diocesan Ultreya was held at St John's Cathedral, following a 40<sup>th</sup> Celebration Eucharist. Cursillo SQ was honoured to have Archbishop Jeremy preside at the Eucharist, assisted by Bp Cam and Rev. Pauline Harley (Diocesan Spiritual Advisor). Bp Ian Palmer, retired National Episcopal Advisor, gave a heartfelt sermon based on Matthew 13: 31-33- Faith like a mustard seed. Cursillo was blessed by this opportunity to celebrate this milestone and we are grateful for the help given by Rev Peter Catt and Rev Dr Ann Solari, plus Cursillista LAs, Rob Clark and Louise Harris, reader Greg Blundell and Howard Greaver with his talented team providing stunning music. Personally, I'd like to thank all our Parish Contacts. Your role is so important and it is clear that more people are becoming curious about Cursillo and ensuring it continues to be a successful movement. Some parish contacts have designated space with Cursillo information, including the new and updated brochure "What is Cursillo?" and "Application form" as well as the A4 "This is Cursillo" poster visible for parishioners to see. These are on the Cursillo-Brisbane webpage under Parish Contact information.

Looking forward into 2026, Cursillistas will have the opportunity to gather as more parishes are taking the opportunity to hold an Ultreya during 2026. More details to follow on these events and others being discussed.

## MEET SAMUEL KURIEN #83

I had the blessing of attending Cursillo #83 on August 22–24 at Luther Heights, Coolum, and becoming a Cursillista. The theme for the weekend was "Grace – Because He Lives." That phrase became more than just words on a banner—it became the heartbeat of my experience and the foundation of what I carried

home with me. When I first arrived, I wasn't sure what to expect. I thought it might be like any other retreat: some talks, some quiet time, and a chance to step away from daily routines. But what I discovered was so much more. From the very beginning, I was embraced by a community overflowing with love, joy, and welcome. There was laughter, warmth, and an immediate sense of belonging that made me feel at home.

Throughout the weekend, I experienced a beautiful rhythm of talks, discussions, meditations, singing, worship, and fellowship. Each part built on the other, gently opening my heart to hear God in new ways. The talks weren't lectures; they were deeply personal stories of how Christ had met people in their brokenness, doubts, and joys. In them, I heard my own story reflected. Their honesty reminded me that faith is not about being perfect—it is about opening our lives to God's grace, right where we are. (2 Corinthians 12:9)

The theme of grace came alive for me in a fresh way. I realised grace is not just a concept or a church word; it is God's love poured out daily, giving me strength when I feel weak, forgiveness when I fall short, and hope when life feels uncertain. (Ephesians 2:8–9) During the meditations and times of prayer, I was deeply moved by the reminder of Jesus' words: "Because I live, you also will live" (John 14:19). His resurrection is not only the source of eternal life—it is also the source of courage, joy, and perseverance in my daily walk. (1 Peter 1:3)

What also struck me was the joy of Christian community. Singing together, sharing meals, praying side by side, and enjoying moments of laughter and sadness—it all reminded me that discipleship is not a solitary journey. By the end of the weekend, the strangers I met on Friday had become brothers and sisters in Christ, fellow Cursillistas, friends who continue to encourage me, pray with me, and walk alongside me. (Hebrews 10:24–25)

But the most important part of Cursillo is what comes next—the Fourth Day, the rest of our lives after the weekend. This is where the lessons of Cursillo are lived out. I came away with a deeper conviction of the continuing need to be:

- Rooted in prayer daily seeking God's presence and strength. (1 Thessalonians 5:16–18)
- Faithful in fellowship staying connected with others in reunion groups and community. (Acts 2:42)
- Bold in witness letting my words and actions reflect Christ, so that others may see His love shining through me. (Matthew 5:16)

These are not just disciplines; they are lifelines. They keep me empowered, motivated, and enduring in perseverance when faith is tested. (Hebrews 12:1–2) They remind me that Christ's grace is more than enough, every single day.

Looking back on my Cursillo #83 experience, I can honestly say it was life-giving. It renewed my faith, deepened my sense of belonging, and ignited a desire to live more authentically as a disciple of Jesus. By His grace and because He lives, we too can live with joy, courage, and hope.

# Days for Girls by Dianne Catto

Days for Girls is a voluntary organisation that creates feminine hygiene kits for girls and women in developing countries. Alongside the kits, we provide vital health education to help break down the stigmas and cultural taboos surrounding menstruation.


The kits are fully washable and designed to last between three to five years. Before receiving a Days for Girls kit, many women endure days of isolation and resort to unimaginable methods—sitting on cardboard, using half a coconut shell, newspaper, corn husks, or other improvised materials to manage their menstrual flow.

This is an international nonprofit organisation founded in 2008. Since then, it has produced and distributed over five million kits worldwide. Geoff and I have undertaken numerous trips to the Pacific region to distribute Days for Girls kits. It was during these trips that I came up with the idea of starting a group in Mackay, where I continue to serve as team leader. When we moved to Wynnum, I remained involved with Days for Girls but missed the community spirit of the project. After COVID, and with the support of local residents, a new group was established in Wynnum.

Last year alone, our dedicated team of volunteers created 1,500 kits, transforming the lives of recipients in Vanuatu, Papua New Guinea, Timor-Leste, Sri Lanka, and Australians in need.

Each kit takes approximately eight hours to produce. Our volunteers meet fortnightly, contributing over 100 hours of service every two weeks. Not only are we providing a vital resource to women in need, but we're also fostering a meaningful community activity for the 15 local women who participate regularly.

Our primary goal is to raise awareness about this project and deliver essential resources to women and girls across Australia and the Pacific.
