WHAT'S CAUSING THE PROBLEM?


Items that should NEVER be flushed, including:

These items clump together, blocking drains and causing toilets to back up and pumps to fail. Tea towels & plastic ties were also found in the pumps

Please remember: if it's not pee, poo or toilet paper, it doesn't belong in the toilet. Thank you for helping keep our plumbing and pumps working efficiently for everyone.
