## Working Together This Winter

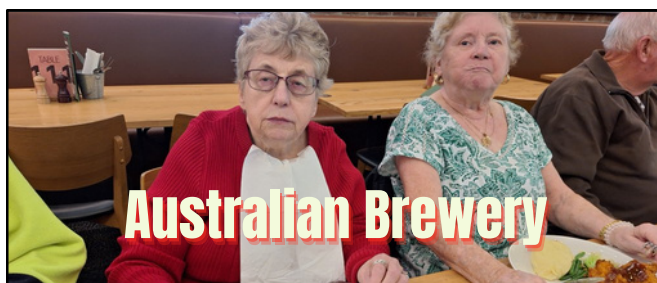
With winter arriving next month, a few simple checks can make a big difference in keeping homes safe and comfortable:

- Check electric blankets are in good working order and arrange servicing of air-conditioners if required
- Inspect door and window seals to help keep warmth in and reduce draughts
- Disconnect garden hoses from external taps on frost-prone nights to prevent frozen pipes and cracked fittings

## Looking Ahead

Next month, the team will begin our annual tree-planting program for the larger trees around the village. This work is an important part of maintaining safety, supporting tree health, and ensuring our shared spaces remain well cared for.

# IMPORTANT

## Fire Safety Compliance Upgrade (1 June - 30 June 2026)

To ensure our village remains safe and compliant with current Fire Safety and Council requirements, we will be upgrading smoke alarms across all units during June.

Contractors will install new hard-wired, compliant smoke alarms in every villa, with each installation taking only a short time. This essential upgrade is fully funded through the Capital Works Fund at no cost to residents. As access to each unit is required, residents will receive their individual appointment date and time shortly. More details to follow.

We appreciate your cooperation as we complete this important safety improvement for the community.

## Grounds Maintenance

May is focused on clearing the old to make way for the new. The gardening team has been busy with seasonal transition work, including extra leaf sweeping across pathways and common areas, preparing garden beds for winter planting with compost and new seasonal colour, and completing pruning and mulching of deciduous trees. In preparation for winter, infrastructure maintenance has also continued, with village-wide gutter and downpipe clearing now complete and pressure washing of shaded pathways underway to reduce moss and improve safety underfoot. Thanks to our excellent grounds team for their ongoing work.

# Elder Abuse

At Windsor Country Village, we are committed to a safe, respectful and supportive community where everyone has the right to feel valued and protected. Elder abuse is never acceptable, and support is always available.

Elder abuse occurs when an older person experiences harm caused by a trusted person or family member. It can be a single or repeated act, and is often hard to identify as those experiencing it may feel scared or ashamed and try to hide it.
