Our Garden and Maintenance Team have been hard at work reviving the village's irrigation system, checking and replacing connections, connectors, and sprinkler heads to keep our gardens, lawns, and flower beds looking their best. The team has also been carrying out repairs to fences, gates, and pergolas.

As part of our ongoing bushfire preparedness program, our Maintenance Team has commenced tree trimming and height control works throughout the village. These actions are essential to ensure compliance with fire safety guidelines and to maintain clear zones around buildings, paths, and open spaces.

Trimming activities will focus on:

- Reducing tree height where necessary to improve safety.
- Removing overhanging branches near roofs, pathways, and fences.
- Clearing vegetation to create defensible spaces in line with bushfire management standards.

Alterations & Contractor Requirements

Alterations Requests

Any alteration or addition to your home or garden must be approved in writing before work begins. Residents are required to submit the completed Alterations Request form along with supporting documents, such as the scope of works, a quote from a licensed contractor, and council approval if applicable. This process ensures that all village standards and meet changes comply with safety and community guidelines.

Use of Contractors

Many residents engage contractors for work around their homes. Please remember that all contractors must be authorised before starting work in the village. Contractors must provide a current licence and certificate of insurance and must sign in and out at the office.

The use of unlicensed or uninsured contractors, or volunteers, is not permitted, as it poses safety and liability risks. Following these procedures helps keep everyone safe and protects our village community.
