Dear Residents,

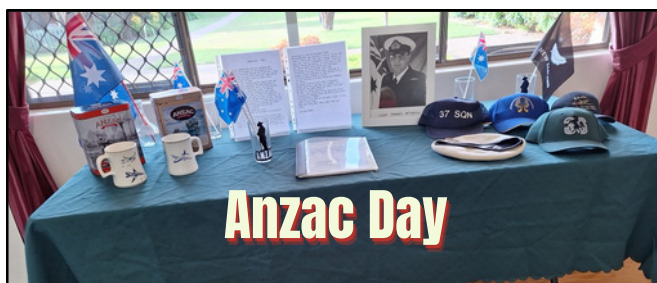
Firstly, thank you all for your patience while the village bus was away for a week undergoing repairs. We appreciate your understanding and are pleased to have it back in service for residents again.

Nature will take care of much of the watering over winter, and this helps us all conserve water during this period.
