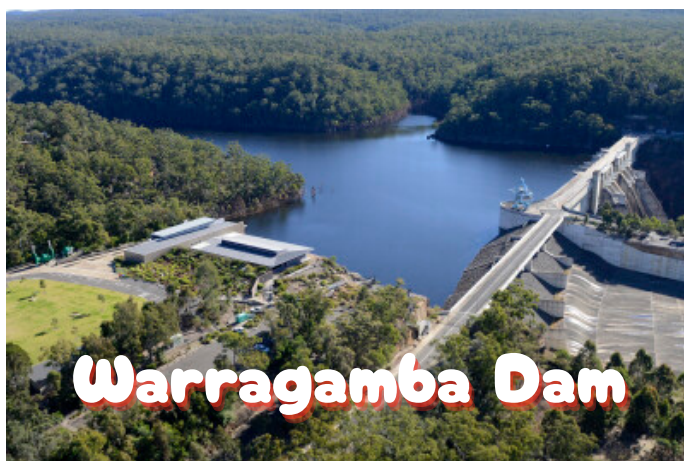
Property Maintenance & Infrastructure

Pets: any changes to the furry residents living with you.

Why it matters: accurate records mean we can reach your emergency contacts straight away if something urgent happens, make sure village notices and event invitations actually get to you, and avoid any mix-ups over vehicles in resident parking.

How to update: simply drop into the Village Office during office hours and we'll pop you through a quick form. It only takes a moment.

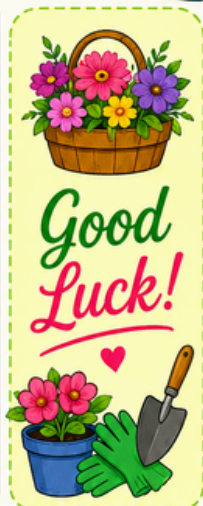
